

On Tuesday, Feb 9, 2016 at 7:30pm, Judy Kantrowitz will discuss her new book *Myths of Termination: What Patients Can Teach Psychoanalysts About Endings (*Routledge, 2015). Psychoanalysis can make a huge difference in the lives of patients, their families and others they encounter. Myths have developed, however, about how psychoanalysis should end - what patients experience and what analysts do. These expectations come primarily from accounts by analysts in the analytic

come primarily from accounts by analysts in the analytic literature which are often perpetuated in an oversimplified form in teaching. Patients' perspectives are rarely presented. In her book, Judy Leopold Kantrowitz seeks to address this omission. Exploring the accounts of 82 former analysands, she illustrates the rich diversity of psychoanalytic endings and ways of maintaining analytic benefits after ending; in presenting patients' experiences Kantrowitz provides correctives for some myths about termination.

On **Monday**, **May 23**, **2016** at **7:30pm**, Ana-Maria Rizutto will talk about her new book *Freud and the Spoken World: Speech as a Key to the Unconscious* (Routledge, 2015).

Our Gifford fund helps to purchase books on the history of psychoanalysis. The Life and Times of Franz Alexander: From Budapest to California by Ilonka Venier Alexander has just been published by Karnac Books. The author is a psychotherapist, the granddaughter of Dr. Franz Alexander, and a friend of BPSI Archives. Ilonka explored our collections last year to learn about Franz Alexander's short time in Boston in 1931,

Anke Timmermann, historian from Cambridge University, UK, contacted us in search for Hanns Sachs's personal library. Katie Joice from the Birbeck College, UK, wanted to check our audiovisual collections for her research of visual culture of child psychiatry and infant observation in the postwar period. Monica McGoldrick, Director Multicultural Family Institute in NJ, was exploring Norman Satir's possible affiliation with our Institute in the 1940s.

Recent Acquisition

Dr. Jeremy Nahum donated over 180 infant research audio-cassettes of the Boston Change Process Study Group to BPSI Archives this fall. The group was founded in 1995 to explore in depth how knowledge of developmental process could creatively inform psychoanalytic therapies and understanding of change in treatment. Its members were Nadia Bruschweiler-Stern, MD, Karlen Lyons-Ruth, PhD, Alexander C. Morgan, MD, Jeremy P. Nahum, MD, Bruce Reis, PhD, Louis W. Sander MD, and Daniel N. Stern, MD. Once processed and digitized, this new audio archive will be a great resource for any infant research historians.
