

Developmental Aspects of MasochismFrances Lang, LICSW

Sexual Perversion in which satisfaction is tied to the suffering or humiliation undergone by the subject.

Freud extends the notion of masochism beyond the perversion as described by sexologists. In the first place, he identifies masochistic elements in numerous types of sexual behavior and sees rudiments of masochism in infantile sexuality. Secondly, he describes derivative forms, notably 'moral masochism' where the subject, as a result of an unconscious sense of guilt, seeks out the position of victim without any sexual pleasure being directly involved.
